THE U4INCLUSION CURRICULUM

During the last months, the project partners have been working on the development of a curriculum which aims to provide adequate and adapted vocational training to young adults with intellectual disabilities between 18 and 30 years old, enabling them to access the mainstream labour market. Thus, this curriculum will provide students with the necessary support to achieve an independent life, participating as full members of their social environment.

The general objectives pursued through this program are:

- Develop self-care skills (health, nutrition, accident prevention, etc.).
- Manage with ease and autonomy in the community environment (transport, itineraries and basic administrative procedures).
- Acceptance of oneself and others.
- Develop work skills to work in different public and private work contexts.
- Develop skills to show initiative to follow healthy habits or promote actions in your workplace.
- Being able to work individually but also as a team player.
- Ability to reflect on one's own actions, considering their results.

The U4INCLUSION project aims to follow a mixed model of higher education, in which students follow a fixed educational pathway with their peer group with ID, while also participating in university activities with other students without disabilities.

This model is combined with an educational approach based on individualized support, adapted to the needs of each student, a more separate model where students participate only in activities with other students with disabilities, in order to use more efficient methodologies adjusted to the group.

The next learning activity of the U4INCLUSION Project will take place on 21, 22 and 23 March. Learning activities are activities designed or implemented to provoke or create the conditions for learning, in this case aimed at students with intellectual disabilities to check if there is an adequate understanding of the materials designed so far in the Project environment.

The course will be directed and organised by the Institut für Inklusive Bildung (Germany) and all project partners will contribute to the organisation and delivery of the training. There will be 5 trainees with intellectual disabilities per participating country (20 in total).

During the online meeting on February 18, the main topics of this activity were discussed, identifying each of the tasks that each partner will carry out for the organization of the learning activity.
